Food shall have an initial temperature of 41°F or less if removed from cold holding temperature control, or 135°F or greater if removed from hot holding temperature control.

Potentially hazardous foods may be displayed at temperatures between 41°F and 135°F for up to 4 hours. The 4-hour limit begins when the food is removed from temperature control.

Food shall be marked or otherwise identified to indicate the time that is 4 hours past the point in time when the food is removed from temperature control. Labels may be hand-written, but must be clear.

Once time is used as a control, food may not be later returned to use temperature as a control. It must be discarded. Therefore, foods may not be refrigerated, reheated or placed in a warmer for later use.

The Following Foods, will be held up to a maximum of 4 hours, using time as a control:
