Breastfeeding benefits mothers and babies

August is National Breastfeeding Month and the Kane County Health Department reminds residents that breastfeeding is the normal and expected way to feed all babies, with numerous benefits to both babies and mothers.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, breastfeeding protects babies from infections and illnesses that include diarrhea, ear infections, and pneumonia. Breastfed babies are also less likely to develop asthma, and those who are breastfed for six months are less likely to become obese, one of the threats to community health and well being identified in the Kane County Community Health Improvement Plan. Mothers who breastfeed have a decreased risk of breast and ovarian cancers.

The Kane County Breastfeeding Coalition, with its mission to support and promote breastfeeding in Kane County, has designed the *Kane Can Do Five Breastfeeding Toolkit for Primary Care Providers*. This Tool Kit will assist primary care providers in implementing policies and protocols recommended by the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP), The American Congress of Obstetricians & Gynecologists (ACOG) and many other health provider professional organizations to assure that breastfeeding is promoted and supported as the best nutrition for babies.
