Poultry products recalled due to misbranding and undeclared allergen

The Kane County Health Department is advising that Harvest Food Group, Inc., a Chicago, Ill. establishment, is recalling approximately 47,332 pounds of Not Ready-To-Eat (NRTE) chicken fried rice products due to misbranding and an undeclared allergen, the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Food Safety and Inspection Service (FSIS) announced today. The products contain milk, a known allergen, which is not declared on the product label.

The NRTE chicken fried rice items were produced on Nov. 12, 2018, Dec. 4, 2018 and Dec. 5, 2018. The following products are subject to recall: [View Label (PDF only)]

 9-oz. cardboard packages of "yumnum global cuisine YAKITORI SEASONED CHICKEN FRIED RICE" bearing lot codes "C041A8K12 BEST BY 11/12/2019," "C091A8L04 BEST BY 12/04/2019," and "C091A8L05 BEST BY 12/05/2019."

The products subject to recall bear establishment number "P-34457" inside the USDA mark of inspection. These items were shipped to retail locations in Illinois and Michigan. The problem was discovered by the firm during a label inventory check.

There have been no confirmed reports of adverse reactions due to consumption of these products. Anyone concerned about an injury or illness should contact a healthcare provider.

FSIS is concerned that some product may be frozen and in consumers' freezers and/or refrigerators. Consumers who have purchased these products are urged not to consume them. These products should be thrown away or returned to the place of purchase. When available, the retail distribution list(s) will be posted on the FSIS website at www.fsis.usda.gov/recalls.
