Scenario

The Oct 25 exercise scenario comprised of a point of distribution center due to banthrox (fictional illness) outbreak. Banthrox tested positive in the salsa which was served at a canoe/kayak race luncheon on Oct 19. Those attending the luncheon came to the Health Department to receive the antibiotic, tetripo (fictional antibiotic) before becoming ill. The public entered the front of the health depart (side A) at 1240 Highland, Aurora to obtain medication. A screener checked the individuals for signs of illness. The “well” went left into the POD and the sick were directed to a triage area. Triage was located in the north hall where the ill will be divided into three classifications – red, yellow and green. An area was available for psychological first aid care. The ill then waited for transportation. Ambulances picked up victims at side D door. Victims also developed medical issues while waiting in the POD. A trauma occurred in the POD (child with pencil through arm) and in the parking lot. The parking lot was a motor vehicle incident with three live victims and one dead on the scene.
