Our I & E Action Team formed to support the career exploration activities that your middle school and other community organizations offer to your students. This is because we studied the health, education, and income data for Kane County and saw that increasing education levels is the best way to increase both income and health!

Kids learn best and dream more about career possibilities when they can see, talk, and listen to people actually engaged in various careers! Therefore, we have created a **Career Readiness Tool Kit** for middle school counselors and CTE Coordinators, modeled after the District 304 high school Community Partners Program.

Career Readiness Tool Kit Components:

1. Sign-Up Form for parents and community members.

You can personalize the form with your school logo, the dates you have career fairs/events scheduled and need volunteers, and the middle school representative for questions and issues. You can change the contact information and check boxes in any way that meets your needs.

- 2. Sign to post at parent gatherings, the front office and other events. Use this sign to attract attention of parents and community members! Personalize it for your needs.
- 3. An online version of the sign up form to post on the career readiness page of your school website. This may help reach more people, even beyond parents.
- 4. A social media post sample to promote your Parent and Community Partner Campaign. Potentially you can send messages through your electronic backpack and through Naviance too!
- 5. Tips for Speakers & for Organizing a Career Cafe.
- 6. Process for follow up on volunteers.
